Discovering Church Discussion

Getting Started:

Make 4 columns on a piece of paper, then label each column: 1) **Scripture** 2) **Own Words** 3) **Questions** 4) **I Will**

Ask each participant to write their answers as follows:

- In <u>column 1</u>, write out the passage, or what you see as being the most important verses, word for word.
- In <u>column 2</u>, write the same verses in your own words. (Write as much or as little as you wish.)
- In <u>column 3</u>, write the answers to the Discovery Questions below.
- In column 4, write what you will do with what you learned in this passage.

Use the following discussion format when you meet together:

Discussion Questions – Written

I) Community Questions

- What are you thankful for?
- What are you struggling with, and how can we help? (Or what is causing you stress?)
- Is there someone outside this group that we should help?

II) Review Questions

- What did we read about last week?
- How did you act on it, and how did that go?
- Who did you share your experience with?

III) New Scripture (Participants can read what they have written.)

A) Bible Passage

- Ask someone to read the Scripture.
- Ask someone to retell the Bible story in their own words.
- Ask others if anything was left out of the story.

B) Discovery Questions (Participants can read their answers to the following questions.)

- What does this story teach us about God?
- What does this passage teach about Jesus' Church? (new question)
- What does this story teach us about people?
- What do you think God wants people to do as a result of reading this passage?

C) Application Questions

- What action do you think God wants you to take as a result of reading this? What will you do? (Start your answer with: "I will . . . ")
- What will we do when we gather to help each other act like Jesus' church? (new)
- With whom can you share about your experience with God through this passage?
- Would you like to do this again next week?
